

Cultural Economy Initiative

PEOPLE

Sustaining the people who create and preserve artistic and cultural products and assets

PRODUCTION

Enhancing capacity for production

MARKETS

Developing new markets for their creations

The Cultural District Program was created as a part of the Cultural Economy Initiative. It is managed by the Office of Cultural Development in the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism under the Office of the Lt. Governor of Louisiana. The Cultural Economy Initiative and Cultural District Program focus on sustaining the people who create and preserve the artistic and cultural assets of Louisiana.

Program Purpose

TThe Louisiana Cultural Districts Program was created by Act 298 of the 2007 Regular Session of the legislature. The primary goal of this initiative is to spark community revitalization based on cultural activity through tax incentives, technical assistance, and resources.



Program Incentives



HISTORIC PRESERVATION

Expands eligibility of state historic tax credits for rehabilitation of commercial structures to cultural districts



TAX EXEMPTION

Local sales tax does not apply to original, one-of-a-kind works of art

There are two tax incentives that come with cultural district certification. One extends eligibility to property owners of commercial buildings for state historic tax credits on historic building renovation projects. The other exempts local sales tax on original, one-of-a-kind works of visual art sold within the boundaries of a Cultural District.

Historic Preservation

- Tax credit up to 20%
- \$5M cap per developer, per district, per year
- Structure must be historic and certified by the State Historic Preservation Office or on the National Register
- Tax credits may be stacked if structure is on the National Register

Local Sales Tax Exemption

- Local sales tax does not apply to original, oneof-a-kind art works sold in a cultural district
- Includes paintings, some photographs, sculpture, pottery, and limited edition prints
- Must still collect state tax of 4.45%
 - Will be revisited in 2025
- Tax exemptions must be documented on parish tax returns

Local Sales Tax Exemption Process



REGISTER

Register for a Tax Account

Number

R-1384

Verify authenticity and document each sale using a Sales Tax Exemption Certificate (R-1384). Exemption is for local sales tax only. State sales tax is 4.45%

R-1384 COPIES

Keep a copy, give a copy to the buyer, & submit a copy with your parish tax return

TAX RETURNS

Enter the total value of sales tax exemptions on your parish sales tax return

- Update business listings quarterly
- Be sure to indicate business type in listing
- BUSINESS LISTINGS DUE NOVEMBER 30
- ANNUAL REPORT DUE January 31
