Eligibility Criteria

High School Students

• The scholarships that are reserved for Louisiana high school students who are studying French at their school will be awarded as follows:

2024 CODOFIL scholarship competition: Louisiana high school students whose school participated in the last two ALCFES conventions are invited to participate in this scholarship competition organized by CODOFIL. The French teachers at each of these schools should collectively select **one** student who is studying French to participate in the scholarship competition. First, the scholarship candidates must compose a letter of motivation (typed, in French and in his/her own words) and submit it to Mrs. Jennifer Rodriguez (<u>irodriguez@crt.la.gov</u>) at CODOFIL by **February 2, 2024**. Then the scholarship candidates will be invited to an interview in French; the exact date will be confirmed at a later time.

Southeastern Louisiana University's (SLU's) Foreign Language Festival: March 22, 2024 at SLU

One scholarship will be awarded to an eligible student in the French IV Extemporaneous Speaking category. - Please note that the age requirement varies for each scholarship and the recipient must meet the age requirement by the time of travel:

Homer & Jason Dyess Scholarship: 18 years of age Université libre de Bruxelles: 18 years of age Université Sainte-Anne: 16-18 years of age

University Students

All candidates must:

be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident of the United States;

be a full-time undergraduate or graduate student (depending on the scholarship) at a public or private Louisiana college or university;

have a declared major in French Education or French Liberal Arts (exceptions: Governor Kathleen Babineaux Blanco and Coach Raymond Blanco Scholarship and Lions Clubs de France);

have an overall GPA of at least 2.5 and at least a 2.75 GPA for French courses;

have completed a minimum of 13 or 15 hours* of university French by June 1, 2024;

*If your university offers 3 credit hours for the beginner-level French courses, students must have completed a minimum of 13 hours of university French. If your university offers 5 credit hours for the beginner-level French courses, students must have completed a minimum of 15 hours of university French. Credit received from Advanced Placement Testing is counted toward credit requirements;

contact their departmental advisor, Study Abroad Office and/or Registrar's Office at their university **BEFORE** applying for a CODOFIL scholarship to discuss the process for transfer credit. Please see the section titled Transfer Credit on page 49 in this guide for more information.

Note: If you are in your final semester of studies, you can apply for a scholarship. For example, you can apply in spring 2024, graduate in May 2024 and travel abroad with a CODOFIL scholarship during the summer 2024.

All candidates must:
be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident of the U.S. and a resident of Louisiana, Texas, Arkansas or Mississippi;
be between 20 and 35 years of age;
be eligible for and accepted into the Teaching Assistant Program in France (TAPIF) with placement in the city of Rennes;
be eligible for and accepted into Centenary College of Louisiana's Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) Elementary Education 1-5 program;
have at least the B1 level of French according to the DELF standards (www.france-education-international.fr/hub/diplomes-tests) or Intermediate Mid/High according to the ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) standards at the time of application;
have a minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.5;
have obtained a bachelor's degree by June 1, 2024;
have a strong desire to teach in French immersion in Louisiana;
be available for an interview in French in March or April 2024;
commit to teaching French immersion for at least three (3) years at a public or public charter elementary school in Louisiana.

have a passing score for the GRE (The GRE requirement is waived for applicants who possess an undergraduate GPA, adjusted or cumulative, of 3.2 on a 4.0 scale.);

demonstrate an Intermediate High level of French proficiency with either (1) a four-year, undergraduate bachelor's degree in French and/or Francophone Studies, or (2) a score of B1 level on the European Framework exam (DELF), or Intermediate High on the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI);

have passing score for all required PRAXIS exams, including the exam in the appropriate content area for your degree.

Escadrille Louisiane: Pathway 3 Alternative teacher certification for future French immersion teachers in Louisiana

Escadrille Louisiane: Pathway 4 Certified French language teachers for French immersion in Louisiana

be a Louisiana certified teacher (PK-12) who speaks French;

have met the standards of teaching effectiveness for two (2) out of the last three (3) years of teaching;

have a strong desire to teach PK-8 French immersion at a public school in Louisiana;

provide a B2 DELF diploma before final acceptance into the program. Any candidate not currently holding a DELF diploma for the B2 level or above must be available for testing in New Orleans;

be available for an interview in French in the spring 2024;

commit to teaching French immersion for at least three (3) years at a public or public charter elementary or middle school in Louisiana.

Professionals

Teachers

All candidates who are **teachers** must:

be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident of the U.S. as well as a Louisiana resident;

be a full-time, K-12 certified teacher of French immersion or French as a Second Language in a public or private school in Louisiana;

have at least the B2 level of French according to the DELF standards (www.france-education-international.fr/hub/diplomes-tests) or Advanced Low/Mid level according to the ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) standards at the time of application.

Non-Teachers

All candidates who are **non-teachers** must:

be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident of the U.S. as well as a resident of Louisiana;

be employed in Louisiana at the time of application;

have a strong desire to improve their French in order to make their workplace more "French friendly." (Find out more about CODOFIL's *Oui!* initiative by contacting Marguerite Justus at mjustus@crt.la.gov or 337.262.5764.).

Scholarships for High School Students

Scholarship covers: The scholarship will cover the registration fee, 4 weeks of French classes, housing,

meals, activities planned by CIDEF, and 5 excursions. The scholarship recipient will be able to choose to stay with a host family or at a privately owned student residence. Each housing option offers a different meal plan. After payment is made to CIDEF for the above-mentioned items, any remaining scholarship funds should

be used toward the purchase of the recipient's plane ticket.

Recipient pays: Passport fee, travel insurance covering medical and repatriation insurance, round-

trip plane ticket, and transportation between the airport and Angers

Program description: The recipient of this scholarship must be 18 years of age at the time of the stay and

will participate in a 4-week summer program in Angers, France organized by the *Centre international d'études françaises* (CIDEF) at *Université Catholique de l'Ouest* (UCO). Upon taking a placement test, the recipient will be enrolled in a French language class according to his/her level (between A1 and C1). In addition to this class, the recipient will participate in a variety of cultural activities such as a cooking class, *châteaux* and museum visits, and a tour of a chocolate factory. Also, he/she will be able to sign up for excursions (i.e. Mont-Saint-Michel and Saint-Malo, *châteaux* in the Loire Valley, beaches in Normandy, etc.). Upon satisfactory completion of the 70 hours of coursework, the recipient will receive a French language and culture certificate indicating his/her level and hours of

coursework.

Travel information:

The program organizers will be expecting you to arrive in Angers on **Monday, July 1, 2024**. Given the 7-hour time difference between Louisiana and France (France is 7 hours ahead of us), you should plan to depart Louisiana on Sunday, June 30, 2024. Upon completion of the program, you will be expected to depart the university to return home on **Saturday, July 27, 2024**.

Please note that the 2024 Summer Olympic Games will take place in Paris and the opening ceremony will be held on Friday, July 26, 2024. For this reason, the CIDEF summer program organizers highly recommend that you arrive in and depart from Nantes (France) instead of Paris. There is a direct train from Nantes to Angers. The recipient can choose to take the airport shuttle, bus or taxi from the airport to the train station in Nantes.

Université Libre de Bruxelles Brussels, Belgium

Wallonie-Bruxelles International (WBI) usually offers three (3) scholarships (2 for ALCFES students and 1 for a French 4 Extemporaneous Speaking student at SLU's Foreign Language Festival) for the *Université Libre de Bruxelles*' 3-week summer program. **Confirmation of these scholarships is currently pending.** The information given below is based on ULB's 2023 summer program; it will give you an idea of what their program usually entails. The information in this section will be updated upon the confirmation of these scholarships.

Program description: On the first day of the summer program, students attend a welcome session and

take a placement test (written and oral) to determine their level of French. Also, a WBI representative distributes a stipend for meals to the scholarship recipients. Students are housed at the Nelson Mandela dorm on ULB's Solbosch Campus.

Students are placed in a French language class according to their level. Classes are held Monday through Friday from 9:00am to 4:00pm, except for the days that are reserved for excursions. Some of the excursions may include, for example, day trips to the cities of Bruges, Bouillon and Anvers as well as museum visits. Upon satisfactory completion of the 60 hours of coursework, students will receive a

certificate during the program's closing ceremony.

Travel information: Please note that there is a 7-hour time difference between Belgium and Louisiana;

Belgium is 7 hours ahead of us. You should plan to arrive at the Brussels airport. The quickest way to get from the airport to ULB's campus is by taxi and it takes

approximately 15 minutes.

Program description: This scholarship is reserved for UL Lafavette students. Undergraduate and

graduate students in any program of study, except education and undergraduate medicine, may apply. If the recipient is an undergraduate student, he/she will enroll and participate fully in a minimum of 24 ECTS (approximate equivalent of 12 credit hours for U.S. College Credit System) for the fall 2024 semester at University of Namur. If the recipient is a graduate student, he/she will enroll and participate fully in a minimum of 18 ECTS (approximate equivalent of 9 credit hours for U.S. College Credit System). The recipient will be expected to arrive at the University of Namur on the appropriate date to participate in a 2-week orientation prior to the beginning of the fall semester. University of Namur organizes this orientation to help facilitate the exchange student's integration into Belgian culture. The orientation consists of French as a second language classes as well as cultural, touristic and culinary activities. The University of Namur will make an effort for the recipient to take his/her final exams in December 2024 rather than the usual exam period in January 2025; however, please note that some professors may not

be able to organize an early final exam.

Named after Escadrille Lafayette, a group of 200 Americans who trained as pilots to fly for the French during World War I, the goal of the Escadrille Louisiane (EL) program is to fill Louisiana's French immersion programs with highly qualified and certified fluent-French speakers from Louisiana who have their state's heritage languages and culture at heart. EL is a program for Louisianans with a college degree who aspire to teach French immersion at a public or public charter elementary school in Louisiana.

This is a 5-year commitment that culminates in obtaining a Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) degree in Elementary Education 1-5 from Centenary College of Louisiana, becoming certified to teach French in Louisiana and being contractually obligated to teach French immersion in Louisiana for at least three (3) years. The students who will be selected to participate in the EL program will begin by spending 3 weeks at Centenary College of Louisiana in Shreveport in June 2024, at which time they will have a pre-trip orientation and take two (2) graduate courses as part of their MAT degree requirements. Then they will spend the first year of the program in the city of Rennes, France where they will work as TAPIF English Assistants (www.tapif.org) in 1-2 French schools and take courses at the INSPE and online with Centenary College. **The program will purchase a round-trip airline ticket to Paris for you.** Participants arrive in France in mid-September 2024 and return home by the end of May 2025. Participants will earn approximately €1,010 gross/€800 net per month from the French Ministry of National Education for their TAPIF duties. Alternative Teacher Certification for Future French Immersion Teachers in Louisiana

This Escadrille Louisiane pathway is for Louisiana residents with an advanced level of French who:

- already hold a Bachelor of Arts or Science degree;
- do not currently hold a teacher certificate;
- are at least at the B2 level of French according to the DELF standards (www.france-education-international.fr/hub/diplomes-tests) or the Advanced Low/Mid level of French according to the ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) standards;
- want to become a certified French immersion teacher without pursuing a master's degree;
- commit to teaching French immersion in Louisiana for at least three (3) years.

In this case, the individual would pursue an approved post-baccalaureate, alternative teacher certification program in Louisiana. To be fully certified to teach French immersion (elementary level) in Louisiana, one must obtain Elementary Education Grades 1-5 certification as well as French K-12 certification.

Qualified individuals may request financial assistance once enrolled in an appropriate alternative teacher certification program. Financial assistance will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

From Monday to Friday, the recipients will attend two formal classes in the mornings and participate in a mandatory workshop (blog, dance, music, outdoor activities, souvenir album, etc.) in the afternoons. In the evenings, there are various social activities including band performances and themed evenings. The recipient will have the opportunity to sign up for excursions (beach trip, canoeing, trekking, whale watching, etc.) for the weekends. The recipients who successfully complete their session will receive a certificate

indicating their completed level of competency in French.

Richard Guidry Cajun and Creole Language Fund (RGCCLF) a fund at Community Foundation of Acadiana



Richard Guidry (1949-2008) contributed greatly to the education and preservation of the French language. This educator, author, actor and consultant dedicated his life to keeping the Cajun and Creole dialects alive in Louisiana. The Richard Guidry Cajun and Creole Language Fund (RGCCLF) was established to support projects and initiatives that encourage, increase and improve the use of the multiple varieties of French in Louisiana, especially their spoken use in public, in the arts and in education. This includes, for example, grants for students and non-students, aid for classroom projects, research, cultural initiatives and media projects for the wider community.

Criteria for grant application and grant recipients:

- All applicants must be U.S. citizens and current residents of Louisiana.
- The applicant's project must incorporate the French language, in whole or in a substantial part.
- Applicants must show how their project will benefit the francophone community in Louisiana and the growth of French in our state.
- Applicants must show an effort to complete the application in their level of French.
- Only complete applications will be evaluated. A complete application consists of the application form, the
 budget form, a narrative and the required appendices. Two copies of all documents (one in French for RGCCLF
 and one in English for CFA), except the letters of recommendation, must be submitted.
- Grants cannot be used for lodging or transportation.
- Selected applicants commit to providing a summary report with receipts and details of how the grant funds were spent no later than thirty (30) days after the project is completed.
- "Richard Guidry Cajun and Creole Language Fund, a fund of Community Foundation of Acadiana" MUST be acknowledged precisely as indicated on the project.
- Grant recipients are allowed only one (1) grant within a two-year period. The two-year period will be determined according to the date on which a grant request is approved.

Grant applications may be submitted online or in writing using the forms available on Community Foundation of Acadiana's website (www.cfacadiana.org). The application deadlines are as follows:

Spring application deadline: March 15, 2024 **Fall application deadline:** September 13, 2024

RGCCLF will award up to three-thousand dollars (\$3,000) in grants in 2024. Project underwriting is typically between \$400 and \$800.

If you have completed an ACTFL Advisory OPI, an ACTFL Official OPI or a DELF exam within the last six (6) months, we will accept your results as part of your scholarship application. If you have not completed any of the above-mentioned tests, you can schedule an ACTFL Advisory OPI, based on the ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines, by contacting:

Upon determining your ACTFL Advisory OPI Rating, Mrs. Rodriguez will add it to your scholarship application file.

Transfer Credit

All Louisiana university students must meet with their advisor and the Study Abroad Office to inform them of their potential study abroad experience and to inquire about potential transfer credit. **This must be done prior to submitting a CODOFIL scholarship application.** If a student fails to comply, he/she risks being unable to obtain any potential transfer credit for his/her study abroad program.

Upon the successful completion of the programs mentioned in this guide, the program organizers will issue a certificate to the participants. It is the responsibility of the university students to present a copy of their certificate to the appropriate person at their Louisiana university in regard to potential transfer credit. The student's home university in Louisiana will determine if transfer credit will be granted to a student.

Important Information for Scholarship Recipients

- It may take a few weeks for the selection committee to conclude the selection process. As soon as it is complete, the applicants will be notified by email about whether or not they have been selected to receive a scholarship.
- Then a letter will be sent to the scholarship recipients with more information about their scholarship and study abroad program along with documents that need to be submitted to CODOFIL.
- **BEFORE** making any travel plans, all scholarship recipients are required to:
 - 1) sign a scholarship acceptance/refusal form;
 - 2) sign a release form;
 - 3) pay a \$200 administrative fee (check or Zelle made payable to Consortium of Louisiana Colleges & Universities) upon acceptance of your scholarship. If the scholarship recipient submits his/her study abroad program evaluation (including photos and video) to CODOFIL by August 15, 2024, half (\$100) the administrative fee will be reimbursed to the individual who paid this fee. If the scholarship recipient fails to submit his/her study abroad program evaluation or submits it after August 15, 2024, no reimbursement will be issued.
- A valid U.S. passport book (NOT a passport card) is needed for your travel abroad. Please apply for your passport book as soon as possible since it usually takes at least 6-8 weeks to receive it. For more information: http://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/passports
- All scholarship recipients must purchase their own international health insurance as well as repatriation insurance. Proof of insurance must be sent to CODOFIL **prior to** traveling abroad.
- In the event that a scholarship recipient declines his/her scholarship after having accepted it and after having received scholarship funds, he/she must immediately return the funds to CODOFIL. CODOFIL will in turn forward the funds to the scholarship donor.
