Summary Paragraph

The Hollygrove Historic District is a mixed-use, working-class urban neighborhood occupying approximately 500 acres northwest of the downtown core of New Orleans in Orleans Parish, Louisiana. The district, which contains 1,669 total resources, is bounded roughly Airline Highway (north), South Carrollton Avenue (east), South Claiborne Avenue (south), and Monticello Ave (west). Developed on former infilled swampy land between 1914 and 1925, Hollygrove's earliest resources date from the 1910s with larger spurts of construction from the mid-1920s through 1941 and in the 1950s-60s. The district began as part of the City of Carrollton prior to its annexation to the city of New Orleans in 1874, and then slowly grew as a suburb as the city of New Orleans grew. Historically, the demographics of the district have been working class citizens, primarily Sicilian immigrants and African Americans. As low-lying drained swampland prone to flooding and crisscrossed by railroad tracks, the area was undesirable to most other residents of New Orleans. However, Hollygrove gave the more marginalized communities the opportunity to purchase and own their own land and property. After World War II and white flight to more suburban areas in the Civil Rights era, the district became primarily African American and remains so to this day.

The district is laid out in a typical grid-like pattern though it also features some distinctive landscape features as there were two major rail lines through the district. One was converted to Earhart Boulevard in the 1960s and 1970s and the other, located roughly three blocks north of Earhart Blvd, was removed, but still remains clearly visible when looking at an aerial of the district. Most buildings are sited at their front lot lines and the streetscapes are generally low-rise and dense in character despite the demolition of some historic fabric due to

disinvestment and blight. The majority of the district consists of single and double dwellings interspersed with institutional buildings such as churches, a school, two parks, and corner store businesses, but its commercial corridors, including primarily Earhart Blvd and S. Carrollton Avenue, are also prominent features that played an important role in the district's history of development. The most common residential types are bungalows and shotguns, and the most common architectural style is Craftsman. Most houses are 1 story and are usually wood-frame construction covered with wood weatherboards. Typical alterations include enclosed porches, replaced windows and/or doors (usually within existing openings), and replacement cladding materials. Most commercial and industrial buildings are brick or CMU construction, and typical modifications include replacement doors/windows within existing openings and, to a lesser extent, modified openings. Despite these modifications and some loss of density, the district retains sufficient historic integrity as a whole and is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.

Narrative Description

District overview:

Location and Setting

The Hollygrove Historic District is a working-class, mixed-use urban neighborhood located approximately 4 miles northwest of New Orleans's downtown core. It sits on the Orleans Parish/Jefferson Parish line just north of the Carrollton National Register Historic District (1987). The district is bounded roughly by Airline Highway to the north, S. Carrollton Avenue to the east, S. Claiborne Avenue to the south, and Monticello Avenue/Jefferson Parish line to the west.

Per oral histories with longtime residents born in the 1930s and 1940s, whose parents were also born in Hollygrove, this area was historically known as part of Carrollton¹. All of the land between the Mississippi River on the south, the Orleans Parish line to the west, Airline Highway/Interstate 10 to the north, and S. Carrollton Avenue to the east was the City of Carrollton until 1874, when it was annexed by New Orleans. The neighborhood became known as Hollygrove ("Holly Grove") as early as 1914, according to period newspapers, and was presumably inspired by Hollygrove Street, which runs northeast-southwest at roughly the centerline of the district. A 1914 article titled "Holly Grove Social Club" discusses meeting at a home on S. Claiborne Avenue, which is the southernmost boundary of the proposed district and is also located within the boundaries of the Carrollton National Register Historic District. The home hosting the club was located adjacent to Hollygrove Street, and it is assumed that it inspired the club's name. Conversely, as late as 1944, some new construction in the proposed district was noted as being constructed in Carrollton.² The Hollygrove Improvement Association was in place by 1970 so the neighborhood was locally known as such by then. The reason for this change between Hollygrove and Carrollton is undocumented, but it is very likely tied up in longstanding racial politics and the desire for one neighborhood to be distinct from another.

Some residents have referred to the southern area of Hollygrove between S. Claiborne and Earhart as "North Carrollton," but no official documentation of this designation has been located. When the Carrollton National Register Historic District was listed in 1987, the boundaries chosen at that time did not reflect the true historic boundaries of what was once considered Carrollton. This decision resulted in irregular boundaries, particularly at the northern boundary of Carrollton where the distinction between Carrollton and Hollygrove becomes less clear. Per the 1987 Carrollton National Register Historic District nomination, "[t]he irregular northeastern boundary in the area from S. Claiborne Avenue to Carrollton Avenue was determined as follows. This area is characterized by bungalows and styled shotgun houses, both of which are classed as contributing to the district. As one moves to the north, there is a gradual drop in architectural integrity (i.e., residing, lost or

replaced windows and doors, etc.).³ At the time of that nomination, the approach to evaluating contributing and non-contributing statuses for individual resources was somewhat different from that of today. Additionally, the period of significance cut-off was 1937 per the 50-year guideline. Thus, bungalows, minimal traditional cottages, and ranch houses would not have been considered old enough to be contributing and would have constituted a concentration of non-contributing resources. The boundaries chosen for the Hollygrove district abut the existing Carrollton boundaries rather than overlap, since doing so would only create confusion among neighborhood groups and residents.

The district consists of approximately 500 acres of land platted between 1909 and 1973 and subdivided and sold off in lots by individual owners. The large size of the district is dictated by the neighborhood's history of development, its ethnic identity, its relationship to adjacent districts, and the size of other National Register historic districts in New Orleans, which are similar to or larger than Hollygrove in acreage and number of resources.

The earliest available Sanborn maps for the area (1909, 1929-40, and 1937-51 series) show a scattered assortment of modest, worker-type housing in the form of small single shotgun houses and cottages as well as a handful of larger single-family dwellings on larger lots. Industrial development is found along the two railroads – Illinois Central and Yazoo & Mississippi Valley (later the Louisiana and Arkansas). These rail lines prominently shaped the district as did the drainage canals on the western and northern edges. The 1909 series shows specific African American landmarks adjacent to the intersection of the Yazoo & Mississippi Valley and S. Carrollton Avenue, including Lincoln Park, a theatre, and an athletic park dance hall. Several African American institutions, including two churches and a meeting hall, had also been established by this time.

The blocks directly around S. Carrollton Avenue had single and double shotguns, but most blocks still had half to the full block empty. Those blocks closest to Claiborne had the highest density as these were the blocks on high land and away from the rail lines. There were several dairies on S. Carrollton as well as a large lumberyard near the intersection of the rail lines and S. Carrollton. The other primary landscape features in the district were drainage canals. Between 1909 and 1937, there was a building boom with developers building single blocks to multiple blocks of single-family houses on reclaimed land from the former swampy area. This building boom is clearly represented by the number of single and double shotguns and bungalows in the Craftsman style that remain in the district today. A second wave of building occurred post-World War II to provide housing to returning veterans; newspaper advertisements show that these new houses were aimed specifically at African American veterans.

The railroads and drainage canals helped to define the early development of Hollygrove and still define the landscape of the district today. Earhart Boulevard replaced one of the rail lines and the other rail line, while devoid of the actual tracks, still remains a distinct landscape feature running in the middle of the district from west to east.

By the 1960s, the district had grown into a well-established, vibrant African American and Italian community with strong industrial spines along the railroad tracks and S. Carrollton Avenue. The blocks surrounding the commercial and industrial corridors had filled in with modest, low-rise housing such as shotgun houses, bungalows, and ranch houses, interspersed with churches, meeting halls, parks, and schools.

The topography is flat except for a portion of Olive Street near the location of the former rail line where the road has been built up. Several lots are landscaped by their owners, many of whom have been longtime homeowners in the district. While surveying the district, the authors learned that many residents have lived in their homes their entire lives, inherited the properties from their parents and grandparents, and while there certainly are rentals, the district does have a high rate of home ownership – 53.8% owner-occupied vs 52% for the entire city of New Orleans.⁴ There are trees throughout the district, with particularly large trees along S.

Carrollton Avenue. Outside of that, there are no consistent rows of street-side shade trees, hedges, or groundcover. All the streets are paved, while many are currently undergoing a years-long repaving campaign. Most blocks have pedestrian sidewalks. Historically, the district had its own bus line that served just this section of town and a streetcar that ran along S. Carrollton Avenue (this line above S. Claiborne was discontinued by the 1950s-60s; today a streetcar still runs on S. Carrollton between S. Claiborne and St. Charles Avenue).

District boundaries

The district is bordered to the west by Monticello Avenue/Jefferson Parish line, Airline Highway to the north, S. Carrollton Avenue to the east, and S. Claiborne Avenue and the Carrollton National Register Historic District (1987) to the south.

The proposed boundaries of the Hollygrove Historic District are based primarily on the district's relationships to surrounding districts and infrastructure as well as the presence of modern non-contributing resources. As mentioned on page 4, the boundaries for what was Carrollton proper ran from the Mississippi River to the south all the way north to present-day Airline Highway/Interstate 10. However, when the Carrollton National Register Historic District was listed in 1987, these boundaries were not followed. Instead, the northern boundary is a jagged line that includes the southernmost section of what became known as Hollygrove. In determining the boundaries for the Hollygrove Historic District, the author chose the logical approach of following this jagged boundary rather than the block grid, which ensures that all properties in the former City of Carrollton are included in a National Register district while avoiding a confusing and unnecessary boundary overlap.

These two districts – Carrollton and Hollygrove – have a long and intertwined history that is important to the history of the city. Because of this history, there have been many disputes between various groups about neighborhood names. Furthermore, institutionalized racism for much of the area's history means that these names carry weight, whether positive or negative. Overlapping the district boundaries of Carrollton and Hollygrove would only create further consternation among these groups. It is important that the proposed boundaries of Hollygrove Historic District both define the area known now as Hollygrove and recognize its significance within the context of Carrollton and New Orleans.

As shown on **Map 3**, the western boundary follows the Jefferson/Orleans Parish line. The northern boundary follows Airline Highway and is a clear boundary as the district did not develop above this point. The main eastern boundary is S. Carrollton Avenue as this was historically the commercial and industrial boundary of the district. There are some irregular boundaries along the western side of the district (i.e., boundaries cut through portions of blocks) to remove modern non-contributing commercial and residential resources from the district. The southern boundary is S. Claiborne Avenue and the adjacent Carrollton National Register Historic District boundaries. In some locations as mentioned above, the boundary lines along the southern and eastern edges expand or contract to eliminate vacant parcels/parking lots or non-contributing resources.

Most of the resources within the district are buildings: residential, some churches, commercial buildings, and a handful of industrial buildings. Sites include two playgrounds, Conrad and Lincoln Playgrounds (i.e., parks), and one baseball field and stadium. Historically, Conrad Playground was for African American residents and Lincoln Playground was for white residents (see Section 8 for further discussion of these resources. This fact further solidifies the ethnic settlement patterns of Hollygrove. There are 8 churches in the district ranging from very simple converted residences to more architecturally detailed purpose-built buildings. These include Grace Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church (3011 Eagle), St. Anthony Divine Spiritual Temple of Christ (3009 Live Oak), Oak Grove Baptist Church (3126 Mistletoe), Word of Life Apostolic Church (3200 Mistletoe), and Nazareth Baptist Church (9108 Pritchard Place). The fact that the district contains many missionary Baptist churches, which were typically African American, and St. Anthony's (St. Anthony is the patron saint of Italy), further illustrates the demographics of the district's settlement patterns.

Summary of Contributing and Non-contributing Resources⁵:

The district consists of 1663 buildings, of which 1275 are contributing (77%) and 388 are non-contributing (23%). (**Map 2**)

Overall District Integrity:

Hollygrove Historic District is a predominantly African American, mixed-use urban neighborhood that developed in two primary phases between 1909 and 1941 (770 resources, or 46% of the district, constructed), and in the post-World War II period, 1945-65 (566 resources, or 34% of the district, constructed), with the district having very few empty lots by 1965. The district possesses integrity of location and setting by virtue of its intact distinctive block patterns, street grid, landscape features created by historic rail lines, and variety of parcel sizes and shapes, which communicate its identity as a diverse urban neighborhood that developed over time versus a wholesale planned development. There has been some loss of historic fabric due to long-term disinvestment and blight, damage due to Hurricane Katrina in 2005 when the district flooded, and recent losses due to fires and demolition; all these factors have had an impact on the district's historic density primarily in the southwest and northwest sections. As seen on the submitted district maps, there are areas of Hollygrove with large areas of loss and subsequent modern infill. This was exacerbated by flooding caused by the levee breaches after Hurricane Katrina in 2005, when many families either could not afford to rebuild or rehabilitate their properties and compounded further still by complicated chains of title that prevented owners from receiving funding to help. Many of these properties, as discussed below and in Section 8, were owned by families for decades and titles were not updated in probate. Furthermore, as described in Section 8, discriminatory practices such as redlining contributed to a lack of investment in neighborhoods like Hollygrove. This led to a delay in alterations made to properties until funding was available. Overall, however, the district still possesses sufficient integrity to convey its historic significance as a well-rooted, vibrant African American and European immigrant community that developed under the constraints of racial segregation.

The majority of all building types (residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and other) in the district remain recognizable as historic buildings. They retain their historic form and massing, some or all stylistic features and exterior materials, fenestration patterns, and relationship to the streetscape. Many of the alterations to the district's housing stock, such as enclosed porches (with screening or glazing panels), the addition of aluminum awnings on the primary façade, replacement siding, and replacement doors/windows within historic openings (leaving the fenestration pattern intact), are common in older working-class neighborhoods nationwide as inexpensive "updates" and do not significantly impact integrity if the building retains enough features to be identifiable as historic. In fact, aluminum awnings are such a common sight in the district and so easily reversed that they are not specifically called out in the building inventory as an alteration. Many of the 1920s-30s bungalows and shotguns in the district were also updated during the second building boom in the district in the 1950s-60s with porch columns replaced with wrought iron columns. Minor alterations to non-residential building types typically include updated storefronts and/or replacement doors and windows within existing openings.

Buildings constructed in the district after the period of significance generally conform to the district's scale and massing and do not significantly impact overall integrity for the district. They are counted as non-contributing due to their age.

Contributing vs. Non-Contributing Status

When considering what makes a resource contributing or non-contributing, various characteristics were considered. As a working-class neighborhood, residential buildings range from highly intact Craftsman

bungalows to residences that retain their overall bungalow or minimal traditional cottage form but have had exterior materials replaced. This district also suffered greatly during and after Hurricane Katrina, so the use of vinyl siding or replacement windows is common. If window openings remain the same as the original size, window replacement is not considered enough to make a building non-contributing. If vinyl siding is the same width as the historic siding, then it is also not considered enough to make a building non-contributing.

Contributing resources are those that retain enough design/materials/workmanship integrity to be identifiable as historic buildings via their form and massing, stylistic features, exterior materials, and fenestration patterns. Sanborn maps, historic aerials, and newspaper advertisements were used when available to determine whether alterations took place within or outside the period of significance.⁶ Most alterations within the district are either reversible or are minor enough to not significantly impact integrity. For example, if a building has vinyl replacement windows within its original openings and vinyl siding similar in appearance to the original cladding, but its other historic features remain intact, then it is classified as a contributing resource.

Small outbuildings such as sheds and garages are not included in the resource count unless they are substantial in size and scale, or their high visibility significantly impacts the streetscape.

There are two types of non-contributing resources: a) those that date within the period of significance but have been so altered that their identity as a historic building is lost and b) those that date outside of the period of significance.

Major alterations that could render a building non-contributing include: permanent porch enclosures that destroyed all identifiable porch features (e.g., removal of porch columns and steps, use of cladding materials and windows/doors as enclosure materials) or the wholesale removal of a porch; the use of replacement cladding materials that differ significantly from the original cladding; significant modification or removal of door and/or window openings and the installation of unsympathetic replacement doors and/or windows; and new additions that substantially impact a building's form and massing or change its building type (e.g., a camelback or full 2nd story on a 1-story building). Typically, it was a combination of these major alterations that resulted in a determination of non-contributing. Each of these major alterations is described in more detail below.

Porch enclosures or removals: The vast majority of residential buildings in the district historically featured a full- or partial-width front porch, which is an important feature not only for an individual building but for the streetscape as well. The enclosure of a porch was considered acceptable if the porch remains discernable via the presence of columns or column bases, steps, and/or the use of reversible enclosure materials such as screening or glazing panels. In contrast, the permanent enclosure of these porches through the removal of all identifying features, the use of siding as an enclosure material, and the installation of doors and windows within the enclosing wall generally resulted in a determination of non-contributing. The same determination was generally made for resources whose porches were fully removed. In select cases, a building with an enclosed or removed front porch still counted as contributing if the building otherwise retains a high degree of integrity. For instance, 3201-03 Colapissa Street (see Inventory entry 36-05060) was deemed non-contributing due to the enclosure of its front porch as well as other modifications, while 3120 Monroe Street (see Inventory entry 36-02344) was deemed contributing despite the enclosure of the front porch because the majority of its historic features remain intact.

Alteration of the façade fenestration pattern: As many of the resources in Hollygrove were built as double shotguns, they have two entries on the façade. Over time, some of these double shotguns have been converted to single family residences. When this was done, the second entry was altered or removed. In some cases, this alteration would result in the resource being non-contributing. In other cases, it was not significant enough to render the building non-contributing. For example, if a second door was removed and replaced with a window with the same width as the former door, this could be considered contributing still. In other cases, the single entry was removed and replaced with materials or items that do not complement or fit in with the other historic features that remain. Furthermore, if a double shotgun's only alteration was the removal of one of the

entries, it remained contributing. Specific descriptions are included in each of the resources to which this situation applies.

Replacement cladding: The most common residential cladding materials in the district are lapped wood weatherboards; asbestos shingle siding; vinyl siding; brick veneer; fiber cement siding; and stucco. Replacement cladding is common and was usually deemed acceptable if it approximated the original siding in dimensions and reveal. Unsympathetic replacement materials, such as simulated stone veneer, or brick veneer on early twentieth-century buildings such as bungalows and shotguns, substantially alter a building's historic appearance or occurred outside of the period of significance (ends in 1973) and therefore typically resulted in a determination of non-contributing. There are examples where brick veneer was added during the 1950s or 1960s, in which case it is considered a historic alteration.

Replacement doors and windows: The replacement of doors and windows is common throughout the district in both residential and non-residential buildings. The most common types are vinyl or aluminum windows and fiberglass doors. This type of modification was typically acceptable if the majority of historic opening locations and dimensions remained intact and the replacement sashes and/or doors did not overwhelmingly compete with the building's historic character. However, if the majority of the historic fenestration pattern or opening dimensions were modified, or were removed and/or relocated, and unsympathetic replacement doors and/or windows were installed, then this was typically deemed a major alteration that impacted integrity.

New additions: Substantial new additions that date after the period of significance (according to available Sanborn maps, historic aerials, and newspaper advertisements) and alter a building's form and massing and/or building type are not common in the district. Where they appeared, they were generally considered so egregious as to render a classification of non-contributing even if there were no other major alterations present. In other cases, they were generally constructed at the rear of a property and do not significantly alter how the building looks from the street elevations. Small side or rear additions that do not compete with the historic building were generally considered acceptable.

Building Types and Architectural Styles:

Hollygrove Historic District consists of a variety of architectural types and styles ranging from 1909 through the modern day. The district's residential buildings are typically simple with restrained or no stylistic detailing typical of working-class urban neighborhoods in New Orleans and other cities throughout Louisiana. The most common residential types are bungalows (26% of the district) and single and double shotgun houses (35% of the district). In addition to single and double residences, there are several variations of low-rise apartment buildings scattered throughout the district. There are several blocks, particularly in the northern section of the district, that include historic multi-family housing. Other types of multi-family housing include a variety of building types such as two-story duplexes and fourplexes, and one-story multiplexes with units arranged from front to rear. The most common domestic architectural style is the Craftsman style (40% of the district), and stylistic features are usually limited to the primary facades. Commercial, industrial, and institutional buildings are addressed separately below. The district also includes many good examples of minimal traditional cottages (18% of the district) and ranch houses from the 1950s and 1960s (16% of the district). Collectively, minimal traditional cottages were often categorized as "other" when surveyed and these, together with ranch houses, which were all built in the same eras, make up almost 52% of the district's resources.

Building Types

Apartment building

There are several apartment buildings in the district that are low rise (1 or 2 stories) and typically contain 2 to 4 units. Most are modern, post-war buildings of concrete-block construction, while others are Craftsman style duplexes and fourplexes dating from the mid-1920s to mid-1940s. There is one large 1974-75 (non-contributing due to age) complex in the northeast corner of the district.

Bungalow

The bungalow is a single-family residential building type that originated in California in the early 20th century.⁷ It is closely associated with the Craftsman or Arts and Crafts style. Although the bungalow began as an exotic, high-style type inspired by South Asian precedents, it was soon adapted for more modest residences and, by the 1920s, had become the foremost affordable housing type in the United States. “Bungalow” is a broad term used to describe a wide variety of small- to mid-scale residences built between c. 1910 and 1935. Typical characteristics include an overall low profile, a height of no more than 1.5 stories, a partial or full-width front porch, and a shallow-pitched overhanging roof (hip, side gable, or front gable). Floor plans are often hall-less and irregular.

Examples of bungalows include: 8600 Oleander Street (c. 1924), 8112 Forshey Street (c. 1930), 3114 Monroe Street (1938)

Commercial

Commercial buildings in the district date primarily to the 1910s through the 1960s and are typically low-rise (1 to 3 stories) and brick or concrete-block construction with no overt architectural style. There are also some corner stores that are wood-frame construction and include dwellings at the side, rear, or in upper floors.

Examples of commercial buildings include: 2941 Eagle Street (c. 1927); 8330 Earhart Boulevard (c. 1971)

Cottage

There are several cottage variations in Louisiana. Those found in Hollygrove Historic District fall into one of three categories: the small, hall-less single or double cottage, usually 1.5 stories, with a hip or side-gable roof and full-width front porch typically dating to the early 20th century; the small 20th-century cottage, a very modest variation that typically includes a side-gable roof and simple floor plan and is commonly combined with the minimal traditional style; and the 1940s/50s/60s minimal traditional cottage with minimal stylistic details.

Examples of cottages include: 2424 Mistletoe Street (c. 1930)

Institutional

This category includes the district's contributing churches and school. The 8 contributing churches date between the 1920s and the 1960s and are typically simple rectilinear structures with a bell tower; most are brick or wood-frame construction. The district's one school, Paul L. Dunbar School at 3201 Live Oak Street, was originally built in 1931 for African American students; it took on 8 feet of water after Hurricane Katrina and was demolished in 2008. The existing modern school was built in 2015 on the same site.

Examples of institutional buildings include Waldo-Burton Memorial Home, 3320 South Carrollton Avenue (1921); Paul L. Dunbar School, 3201 Live Oak Street (2015); Little Flower Daycare, 3800 Eagle Street (c. 1940)

Industrial

Industrial buildings in the district typically date to the 1910s through the 1970s. The majority are 1-story brick or concrete-block and metal warehouses. The most prominent industrial buildings in the district include NOLA Box Supply, Carrollton Lumber and Wrecking, and American Chicle Company (NRHP, 1998).

Examples of industrial buildings include NOLA Box Supply, 8501 Earhart Boulevard (1935-45); 8400 Earhart Boulevard (c. 1971)

⁷ The term “bungalow” is based on a Hindi term used to describe a house in the South Asian “Bengal” style and has been traced back to the 17th century. The focus of this definition is the early 20th century American adaptation of the bungalow.

Recreational

Like many New Orleans neighborhoods, Hollygrove has two “playgrounds” – Mamie Conrad and Cucina-Byrnes. In New Orleans, large parks with open fields are called playgrounds (versus the idea that a playground has to include playground equipment). Both playgrounds have long histories within the district (see their individual inventory entries for more information) and are considered contributing resources. Furthermore, Lincoln Park and the Larry Gilbert baseball stadium has been a part of Hollygrove since 1942. These recreational resources play important roles within the district.

Infill

The non-contributing resources that date outside of the district's period of significance are all buildings. Most infill in the district is residential, with a scattering of commercial, institutional, and industrial examples. It is sympathetic in size and setback in relation to the historic building stock as well as complementary to the historic architectural styles used in the district. Many of the newly constructed buildings mimic the historic shotgun, double shotgun, or bungalow form as well as the details of the Craftsman style. This helps the infill to fit in visually and not significantly detract from the district's overall integrity.

Examples of infill include: 2932, 2936, and 2940 Eagle Street (2022); 9213, 9211, 9205, 9203 S. Claiborne Avenue (2021-22)

Other

There are a handful of buildings in the district that are either rare examples of other building types or difficult to classify. For instance, there are several examples of raised-basement houses in the district (e.g., 8929-31 Colapissa Street) and foursquare houses (e.g., 8815 Pritchard Place). There is also one Quonset hut building at 8140 Forshey Street (c. 1940)

Ranch

Ranch houses replaced the shotgun house, cottage, and bungalow as the predominant affordable residential building type after World War II. They are typically 1 story, single-family dwellings with a low-slung, horizontal emphasis, and hip roof with extended boxed eaves. There is a particular ranch house type that is repeated in the district that includes a front gable with a diamond louvered vent and a small porch (either intact or enclosed) on the far left side. Most ranches in the district are wood-frame construction clad in brick or stucco with minimal exterior ornamentation. Many feature picture windows and decorative metal supports.

Examples of ranch houses include: 8715 Stroelitz Street (c. 1951), 8722 Palmetto Street (c. 1963), 8602 Palmetto Street (c. 1955)

Shotgun

The shotgun house, perhaps the most popular historic vernacular residential type in Louisiana, is the most common type in the Hollygrove Historic District after bungalows. Shotguns are characterized by their hall-less linear floor plan and simple rectangular footprint. Most examples have full-width front porches and either front-gable or hip roofs. The two common shotgun sub-types in the district are the single (2-bay) shotgun and the double (4-bay) shotgun. Examples in the district range from very modest 2- or 3-room shotguns to larger 5-room doubles.

Examples of shotguns include: 8407 Oleander Street (1926), 9007 Belfast Street (c. 1939), 8912 Apricot Street (c. 1930)

Split-level

Within Hollygrove, there is a unique building type that has been identified as a variation of the split-level house. These houses have a one-story section that is slightly raised on one side and a two-story section on the opposite side. Most have a front gable roof over the two-story section that continues down over the one-story section. Some of these split levels originally had a one car garage on the ground floor of the two-story portion; however, most were infilled during the period of significance to capture the space for interior use. Others were not built with garages, and these are noted as such in their individual descriptions.

Architectural Styles

Italianate

The Italianate style was used in Louisiana past the 1880s and applied to various building forms including shotgun houses and commercial blocks. The style is highly ornamented, including round arch-topped windows and doors, segmentally arched openings, quoining, low pitched roofs, two to three stories, tall narrow windows, moderate to wide overhanging eaves supported by brackets, and elaborate window headers.⁸ The Italianate style, common throughout many of New Orleans' historic districts, is not as common in Hollygrove mainly due to the fact that its earliest historic resources date to the 1910s. There are a handful of Italianate resources, primarily single or double shotgun houses.

Examples of Italianate include: 8923 Belfast Street (c. 1930)

Craftsman

The Craftsman (or Arts and Crafts) style is very common throughout the district. Typical features include exposed rafter tails, extended eaves, extended rafter beam ends, knee braces, false beams, paired windows, wood porch colonettes on brick piers, and multi-light window sash configurations with vertical muntins. While the Craftsman style is often synonymous with the bungalow type, it was also commonly applied to other residential types such as shotgun houses. There are many examples of Craftsman-style shotguns throughout the district. Some modest Craftsman examples exhibit only one or two stylistic features, such as exposed rafter tails and extended eaves.

Examples of Craftsman include: 8517-19 Forshey Street (c. 1931); 8523-25 Forshey Street (c. 1928), 8617 Colapissa Street (c. 1935)

Mid-Century Modern

The Mid-Century Modern style is characterized by a horizontal emphasis, clean lines, and lack of ornamentation. Typical features include ribbon windows, curtain walls, cantilevered overhangs, and geometric detailing. Within this overall type, the most common subtype, found the most in Hollygrove, are the minimal traditional cottages or transitional ranch houses, which have a form between a cottage and a higher style ranch house.

Examples of Mid-Century Modern include NOLA Box Supply, 8501 Earhart Boulevard (1956), 8601 Oleander Street (minimal traditional, c. 1950)

Plain/No Style

Most commercial and industrial buildings in the district do not possess an architectural style (e.g., 8370 Earhart Boulevard). In addition, most ranch houses, as well as several other residential buildings, also fall into this category because they either lack any stylistic ornamentation (e.g., 3528 Monroe Street) or they do not fit within an academic style category (e.g., 8516-18 Apricot Street).

Examples of Plain/No Style include: 3528 Monroe Street (c. 1948), 3532 Monroe Street (c. 1952), 8516-18 Apricot Street (c. 1968)

Other

The Other category encompasses the various styles found in only a few buildings in the district. Typically, early twentieth-century styles, these include Neoclassical Revival, Tudor Revival, Queen Anne, Mission/Spanish Colonial Revival, Mediterranean Revival, Eclectic (the combination of 2 or more styles), and Art Deco/Moderne. Examples in Hollygrove are typically applied to a double or single shotgun house.

Hollygrove Historic District is significant at the local level under Criterion A: History in the areas of Ethnic Heritage: Black and Ethnic Heritage: European for its association with the African American and Italian immigrant experience in New Orleans. It is also eligible under Criterion A: Community Planning and Development for its association with early suburban growth of the city of New Orleans by filling in former swamps, particularly for these two underserved communities. Both groups were historically marginalized and discriminated against in New Orleans, particularly during the early to mid-twentieth century. During this period, Jim Crow laws enforced racist segregation practices against African Americans, and thousands of poor Italian (primarily Sicilian) immigrants arrived in the city looking for better opportunities but were confronted with discrimination of their own. The ample and affordable, albeit undesirable, land in Hollygrove afforded these groups an opportunity to own their own property at a time when divisive housing practices were rampant. Despite the passage of the Civil Rights Act in 1964, segregation practices continued well into the 1970s, particularly against the African American population in New Orleans. Originally part of the large McCarty Plantation, the land that makes up Hollygrove was purchased by the New Orleans Canal and Banking Company in 1831 to construct railroad lines through the area. Low lying and swampy, it was initially part of the New Orleans' suburb of Carrollton but remained undeveloped until the 1910s and 1920s, when all of Hollygrove was graded and made accessible for construction. The period of significance spans from 1909, when the earliest resources within the district were built and Italian and African American residents began to populate the area, to 1973, the current 50-year cut off.

Criterion A: Community Planning and Development and Ethnic Heritage: A Mixed-Use African American and Italian immigrant Community Shaped by Segregation

Development of the District:

Hollygrove was originally part of the City of Carrollton, a municipality founded upriver from the City of New Orleans in 1833. Carrollton was platted from part of the McCarty Plantation, which had been established c. 1816. Barthelemy McCarty (also known as Macarty) was a Scotch-Irish Creole who purchased the land, which his son developed into a sugarcane plantation. Through the 1820s, the McCarty descendants realized their land was extremely valuable.⁹ By 1831, McCarty heirs had sold half of the land to prominent landowners Samuel Kohn and Bernard Marigny, and the other half to the New Orleans Canal and Banking Company. The New Orleans Canal and Banking Company saw the potential for development and hired Charles Zimpel, a local surveyor, to draw up plans for its acreage, which would become the City of Carrollton. The plan divided the usable land into squares measuring 650 feet on each side, which were subdivided into parcels. This plan covered the southern portion of the former McCarty Plantation, where the existing Carrollton National Register Historic District and the proposed Hollygrove Historic District are located.¹⁰ As explained in Section 7, Hollygrove was originally called Carrollton by early twentieth-century residents and represents a portion of the original City of Carrollton. The neighborhood was referred to as Hollygrove ("Holly Grove") as early as 1914, according to period newspapers, and was presumably inspired by Hollygrove Street, which runs northeast-southwest at roughly the centerline of the district.

In 1846, Carrollton Avenue was opened to the New Orleans Navigation Canal, which runs along the northern edge of Hollygrove. Initially, Carrollton Avenue was a plank road and later upgraded to a shell road by 1862. The three railroad tracks of the Illinois Central and Louisiana and Arkansas (later Yazoo & Mississippi Valley) railroads were completed in 1878 and crisscrossed the otherwise undeveloped northern part of the McCarty Plantation; these lines would eventually shape the Hollygrove neighborhood. As Carrollton developed to the south, portions of the swampy northern area remained low-lying and through the 1920s, except for the land along S. Claiborne and S. Carrollton, which was developed first. With the invention of methods for draining

swampy land as well as a city-wide drainage system first studied and implemented in the 1890s and in place by 1925, Hollygrove and similar areas in the city, including those along Lake Pontchartrain, could finally be converted into usable land for development.¹¹ In addition, the expansion of the streetcar system in the 1880s, with a major line added along S. Carrollton at Claiborne Avenue, connected these areas to the rest of New Orleans and the downtown business district.

The earliest built resources within the district dated to 1871, when houses, commercial resources, and industrial resources were constructed along S. Carrollton, S. Claiborne, and the Yazoo & Mississippi Valley and Illinois Central Railroad lines. While these earliest resources are no longer extant, they were replaced by other historic resources along the same commercial corridors and around the rail lines. Sanborn maps from 1909 show that the blocks directly around S. Carrollton Avenue had single and double shotguns, but that most blocks still had half to the full block empty. Those blocks closest to S. Claiborne had the highest density as these were the blocks on high land and furthest from the rail lines. There were several dairies on S. Carrollton as well as a large lumberyard near the intersection of the rail lines and S. Carrollton. One of these dairies was formerly located in the 3400 block of S. Carrollton Avenue, where the current post office stands. Cloverland Dairy (1924), later the Sealtest Dairy (1950-1970s) were located on this site. In 1981, most of the building was demolished when the US Postal Service bought the property and today, only the façade of the former dairy remains, complete with cow heads in the frieze.¹²

The other primary landscape features in the district were drainage canals. Today, two of these canals remain, one along the Jefferson/Orleans Parish line and one at Palmetto Street in the northern section of the district. In 1909, there were also drainage canals at Dublin and Stroelitz. Additionally, there was a log basin for the lumberyard at Peach and Dublin Streets.

Early newspaper articles note that there was a city garbage dump on Oleander Street in the district as early as 1911, which caused numerous quality-of-life issues for the district's pioneering residents. It was abolished by 1922, and the garbage from the dump was used to fill the drainage canal at Oleander and Dublin, which made the land developable.¹³ The Italian American Macaluso family, longtime residents and developers in Hollygrove, were professional builders who developed many of the district's empty lots during this period, including the six double shotguns at 3014-38 Leonidas Street (NRHP, 2021) and in the 3300 block of Joliet Street. There are several of these rows, ranging from 3 or 4 to an entire block throughout the district.

By 1929, most blocks in the district had at least half the block developed with single and double shotgun houses. There were also some fully developed blocks nearest to S. Claiborne and S. Carrollton Avenues in the southeast and northeast quadrants. Undeveloped blocks were mainly found adjacent to the rail roads as well as in the southwest section. This is consistent with the development pattern of the district with construction starting closest to S. Claiborne and S. Carrollton and then moving north and westward as time went on. Various businesses were established in the district by this time, and the dairies along S. Carrollton had closed. Industrial activity had reduced but the rail lines were still a prevalent part of the neighborhood. The 1937-51 Sanborn series indicates that development in the district increased significantly during this period. The streets remained unpaved, but most blocks were full of residences, corner stores, and other community spaces such as the park that was later named Cuccia-Byrnes playground.

In 1931, the Paul L. Dunbar school at 3201 Live Oak (or 9330 Forshey) was constructed for the neighborhood's African American students. A November 1931 *Times Picayune* article titled "Progress Pointed Out in Dedication of Dunbar School," noted that "the new Paul Lawrence Dunbar negro public school, 9330 Forshey Street, was dedicated Sunday afternoon. The school, opened in September, was erected at a cost of \$66,000 and has accommodations for 480 pupils. The dedicatory address was delivered by Rabbi Louis Binstock, who called attention to the progress negro education has made in New Orleans in recent years."¹⁴ Former students and residents fondly remember the Dunbar School as a serious place focused on learning and described it as "...just a big family."¹⁵ The school served the community for over 70 years until Hurricane Katrina in 2005, when over 8 feet of water inundated the buildings. The next decade was a tense fight over saving the historic building and constructing a new school on the site. Ultimately, the historic school buildings were demolished and replaced with the existing school in 2015. While the Dunbar school served Hollygrove's African American students, the school for the neighborhood's Italian residents was in the Carrollton neighborhood south of S. Claiborne Avenue.

Newspaper articles from the 1930s and 1940s reported on builders constructing large groups of houses throughout Hollygrove, mostly for sale, but some also for rent. For example, on two squares bounded by Apple, Nelson, Hamilton, Hollygrove, and Monroe, 36 single five-room homes were built in 1936 alone by O. Bechtel & Son. The next year, the same company, who had built 30 homes that year, had two underway and another eight planned. In addition to single homes, there were also duplexes and smaller apartment buildings being constructed. A handful of these remain and were generally constructed in pairs or groups (see the five houses at 8517 through 8539 Forshey Street for example). Joseph Macaluso, a real estate developer and contractor who immigrated to New Orleans from Palermo, Italy, c. 1900, lived and worked in the Carrollton and Hollygrove areas from at least 1915 and, in the 1920s and 1930s, built dozens of singles and doubles in Hollygrove to rent or sell. Developer Curtis F. Scott, who was also the head of the Homestead Clearing House Association and

President of Guaranty Savings and Homestead Association, built several two-story apartment buildings on Palm Street.

As with most construction in the country, the World War II years saw a slowing in major single family residential growth, except for the construction of Orleans Park (later renamed Palmetto Apartments), built to house war workers. The complex was built in 1944 to provide rental housing to workers in New Orleans' defense-related industries. It was the first project in the city to be constructed under the Federal Housing Administration's Section 608 program, which authorized the FHA to insure mortgages on large-scale emergency rental housing developments for war workers. Because of guaranteed mortgages up to 90% of the "reasonable replacement cost" of the completed project, private developers were incentivized to build new multi-family apartment complexes near vital defense-related plants. Final plans for the complex included 124 apartment units (one- and two-bedroom apartments) in 20 two-story buildings in two blocks of the northeast corner of Hollygrove bounded by Palmetto, Joliet, Cambronne, and Peach Streets and bisected by Dixon Street. This complex represents the largest construction project in Hollygrove during the World War II years.¹⁶ Following the war, as with other areas of the city, state, and country, there was another wave of construction targeting veterans returning home. In Hollygrove, advertisements were placed aimed particularly African American veterans for new homes in Hollygrove.¹⁷

A key development in the district came in the early 1950s when the railroad tracks along present-day Earhart Boulevard were removed. In its place, a double roadway was planned to provide access between Jefferson and Orleans Parish, linking Metairie to the city and the downtown business district. The stretch of Earhart Blvd that runs through Hollygrove was not completed until the late 1960s, but even in its planning stages the future artery fueled development in Hollygrove, primarily commercial development along the boulevard.

In the late 1960s and into the 1970s, Hollygrove experienced white flight in response to the 1954 Brown v. Board of Education ruling that mandated school desegregation. The first schools in New Orleans were desegregated in 1961. However, it is well documented that full desegregation did not occur until well into the 1970s throughout the city and state. At that time, the demographics of Hollygrove consisted of mostly working class and middle-class African Americans and Italian Americans. The white residents of Hollygrove, mostly of Italian American descent, began leaving Hollygrove for the suburbs of Metairie and Kenner. Most of the businesses, particularly the grocery stores, were owned by Italians, and their closure impacted the community. Furthermore, many of those who fled retained their residential properties in the district and began renting them to new residents, most of which were from lower economic classes. A subsequent rise in poverty and crime in the community spurred some black middle-class residents to leave Hollygrove as well, including a number of long-established families.¹⁸

From the 1970s into the early twenty-first century, Hollygrove has experienced loss due to blight, suburban flight, crime, and flooding and damage from Hurricane Katrina. While others had given up on Hollygrove following Katrina, its residents never did. They made every effort to rebuild their community's houses, schools, and community programs to bring back the Hollygrove that they had known for the last 90 years. Today, the district still retains a strong sense of identity and vacant lots are being infilled with new construction.

While the loss of physical fabric over the past 50 years is regrettable, the buildings that remain tell the important story of a community built largely by and for African Americans and Italian immigrants during the period of Jim Crow segregation, at a time when many of these residents did not have the opportunity to own their own property.

The district's significance, as described in the following sections, relates to the historic context "The African American Experience in Louisiana," prepared by Laura Blokker for the Louisiana Division of Historic Preservation in 2012.

It is worth noting that Hollygrove's earliest African American residents came to the area either from other neighborhoods in the city, where they were not able to own their own property, or from outside the city. Both groups came to Hollygrove either just before or following the 1915 hurricane that devastated nearby Plaquemines Parish and left parts of Carrollton (of which Hollygrove was originally part), under up to 8 feet of water, particularly near the Mississippi River due to levee failure. The 1915 storm was the deadliest hurricane at the time until Hurricane Betsy in 1965. The area of Carrollton closest to the Mississippi River was called "N*ggertown"¹⁹ in the latter 19th and first half of the 20th century and was roughly bounded by S. Carrollton, St. Charles Avenue, Broadway Street, Perrier Street, and the Mississippi River. This term is clearly derogatory and will not be used again in this nomination. Rather, the name Black Pearl, a name given to the area in the 1970s by planning committees who were working on new maps of the city's neighborhoods will be used.²⁰ This triangular section was home to many African American working-class families, including the Irons family, who moved to Hollygrove in the first two decades of the 20th century and became a cornerstone of the community.

Prior to the creation of Hollygrove, the Black Pearl neighborhood was the main neighborhood for the city's African American residents. However, with the damage incurred in the 1915 storm and subsequent flooding, many residents left the area because they had lost everything and started over in Hollygrove. As a largely undeveloped area, Hollygrove proved to be similar to their previous homes, either in Black Pearl or in neighboring Plaquemines Parish. At that time, Hollygrove was one of the only areas of town where African Americans could live with a sense of pride and freedom, to an extent, and own their own property. Resident Marilyn Mercedes Collins Cook notes, "This area was really a wilderness then."²¹ The Irons family bought a large piece of property at 3524 Hollygrove Street with land that was bounded by Palm, the 17th Street Canal, General Ogden, and Hamilton where they had cows and large gardens where they grew okra, corn, string beans, and other produce.²² There may have been some other locations in the city where African Americans settled, but none were like Hollygrove in that the other locations were marginal in terms of location and quality. Hollygrove offered large pieces of property with opportunities to grow as well as a larger space in general to create a true community. It would remain this way until the 1950s when Pontchartrain Park subdivision (listed on the National Register in 2020) was developed specifically for African American families following World War II.

The development of Hollygrove in relation to community planning and development directly relates to the decision to utilize marginal or submarginal land, that was swamp just a few years earlier, to create a place where disenfranchised communities like African Americans and Italian Americans could live and own property. Over the course of the 20th century, land was developed from all sides of the district until all of the platted land was occupied. The section below further discusses the discriminatory practices that impacted Hollygrove prior to and after World War II.

History of Discrimination against African Americans and Italian Immigrants in New Orleans

It is well documented that there has been systemic racism against African Americans for centuries in the United States. Additionally, racism has been extended to other groups of people who do not fit into the accepted definition of "white," including people who emigrated from Italy (and particularly Sicily) to New Orleans and similar port cities throughout the United States.

Italians first arrived in Louisiana after the Civil War, when the planter class needed cheap labor following the abolition of slavery. This is not to say that Italian immigrants replaced enslaved African Americans, but

rather that they began to make up a portion of the labor force once some emancipated slaves began to migrate north. As has happened with other waves of immigration, the new immigrants to America intimidated and scared the American public, and white Europeans were separated into “races” upon entering the country. Per “How Italians Became ‘White,’” author Brent Staples notes that “[s]ome [Europeans] were designated “whiter” — and more worthy of citizenship — than others, while some were ranked as too close to blackness to be socially redeemable.”²³ Not only did Sicilian immigrants, in particular, face discrimination at home in Italy, where northern Italians viewed them as uncivilized and “too African” to be European, but they also faced discrimination once they arrived in America. Slanderous journalism, which called the immigrants “wretchedly poor and unskilled” further spurred discrimination against the group. Italians were also deemed akin to African Americans as they accepted traditionally African American jobs once they arrived in Louisiana. They first settled in tenements in “Little Palermo,” located in the blighted lower French Quarter, and other established working-class neighborhoods along the Mississippi River, including Faubourg Marigny and Bywater.²⁴

As the years passed and the Italian communities in Louisiana and New Orleans grew, they chafed against the low wages, subpar housing, and terrible working conditions that were available to them. They began to open their own businesses in their neighborhoods and catered to local African Americans with whom they fraternized regularly and even intermarried with. This “proximity to blackness” led white Southerners to continue to view them as not “fully white” and, thus, open to continued discrimination.²⁵

One particularly awful incident of this discrimination was an 1891 lynching of 11 Italians in New Orleans following the assassination of Police Chief David Hennessy. It was posited that Hennessy was murdered due to his involvement in a feud between two Italian businessmen. A so-called witness stated that two Italian men had shot the police chief; however, a jury would go on to acquit the men accused of the crime due to a lack of evidence. However, before they could be released, an angry mob of New Orleanians, numbering 5000+ people, broke into the prison and killed the acquitted men.

Across the South, another 42 Italians were lynched between 1886 and 1910.²⁶

Redlining and Housing Policy

According to Blokker’s “The African-American Experience in Louisiana” historic context, “[H]ousing conditions are often directly affected by important broad patterns of our history. Just one example of this is the way that segregation and exclusionary housing practices influenced the domestic situations of African Americans.”²⁷ In New Orleans, these practices included limited options for quality affordable housing, the absence of a municipal building code regulating slum or tenement conditions (until 1910), racist zoning practices, the lack of access to funding sources such as mortgages, and, beginning in the 1930s, the practice of redlining, i.e., the mapping of neighborhoods as “good” or “bad” based on racial demographics. This environment explains why Hollygrove developed in the early twentieth century as a neighborhood composed of primarily African American and Italian immigrant residents, whose limited options in other established neighborhoods drove them northwest to find better rental housing and ownership opportunities on land that was ample and comparatively cheap due to its undesirable status.

The below context, reprinted in italics from the Pontchartrain Park Historic District (NRHP, 2020), details the history of redlining and discriminatory housing practices in New Orleans and around the country. The information has not been paraphrased because the way it is written cannot be improved upon and is important to describing the practice that was specifically used against areas like Hollygrove:

[R]edlining became a practice that actively disenfranchised numerous groups, not least of all the Black community and the poor. Preferential treatment and easier access to fair funding had existed in the

United States for decades, but in the 1930s these practices were endorsed by federal entities. In 1933, the Home Owners' Loan Corporation (HOLC) was formed with the objective of preventing foreclosures during the Great Depression. Along with the National Housing Act of 1934, which established the Federal Housing Administration (FHA), a new era of federal influence in housing policy began. A system of loans was made available to homeowners who were unable or faced great difficulty in making payments on their mortgage "through no fault of their own." These loans typically had relatively low interest rates and much longer repayment schedules than other loans available at the time. Where a typical bank loan had an average payback period of around five years, the HOLC loans were paid back over 15 years. The interest rate of 5% was lower than the typical 6-8%. They were usually amortizing, which meant that equal payments would be made each month during the repayment period. In their first two years, the HOLC made more than 1,000,000 loans.

As with any lending venture, there was risk for the lending agency if those who entered into an agreement were unable to make payments. Upon foreclosure, the HOLC could choose to rent or sell the property. In order to minimize the number of borrowers who failed to make payments, the HOLC sought to define what would be a worthy investment. The Federal Home Loan Bank Board, also recently created, compelled the HOLC to create and define maps of many American cities to categorize zones of "good investments" and "bad investments."

HOLC's methodology for distinguishing "good" from "bad" was geographic. Municipal maps were taken, and residential areas were divided into four zones. Type A zones were most desirable, mostly new developments on the outskirts of city cores. Type B were defined as "still desirable," and were often older but wealthier portions of the city, but still mostly on (or formerly on) the fringe of development.

Type C was defined as "definitely declining." These were found mostly near the central core but permeated all areas of the city. The fourth zone, Type D, was for the most run-down and undesirable areas, defined by the HOLC as "hazardous."²⁸ *In order to apply these definitions evenly to different cities, HOLC appraisers were highly trained in using criteria such as "age and condition of housing, transportation access, closeness to amenities such as parks or disamenities like polluting industries, the economic class and employment status of residents, and their ethnic and racial composition." In practice, many minority neighborhoods were categorized as Type C or D at a higher rate than white neighborhoods.*

This is not to say that the HOLC maps were the start of redlining in the United States. Rather, they may be viewed as a snapshot of planning values of the 1930s. Private lenders and local government had a long history of failing or refusing to serve minority communities, and this was conflated in the segregated South. Sources that overtly state a policy of discrimination are few; instead most reveal an unspoken policy that is reflected in data concerning to whom and where mortgages were made, as well as the quality of the loans. There also are some examples of direct statements, such as at the Mortgage Conference of New York in 1932 that encouraged avoiding areas with Black populations.

By 1939 the Federal Housing Administration had created their own surveys, which were similar in some regards to the HOLC maps but were not as heavily curated, even partnering with lending groups to conduct research. Racist language here was more overt, including as criteria "protection from adverse influences" and "infiltration of inharmonious racial or nationality groups" for rating neighborhoods. While the HOLC maps, served to highlight a static view of cities at the time of map creation, FHA mapping criteria used terminology that implied change, such as "infiltration" listed above. The FHA also had an active role on housing policy, which included offering insurance for lenders so long as their guidelines were followed. This insurance was more financially feasible in areas highly rated by the FHA, so lenders were incentivized to only offer loans to properties endorsed by a federal agency.

The FHA would go on to support redlining in the form of restrictive covenants in the 1930s and 1940s. This included providing an example of such a covenant in its manual until 1948. Official literature used


phrases such as “undesirable encroachment” and listed “inharmonious racial or nationality groups” as detriments to a neighborhood. Postwar suburbs offered an opportunity to keep these communities away from the outset. This was not merely found in the segregated southern United States. Covenants were first utilized in South Burlington, Vermont. Restrictions to homeownership had huge impact in shaping the post-war American city, with Black families mostly excluded from the investment and stability of homeownership provided to white families.

New Orleans, like other American cities, saw lenders set different rates or fail to serve certain communities. Jim Crow laws, such as voting restrictions and the Grandfather Clause that disenfranchised poor Black citizens specifically, were on the books and – in the case of the latter – codified in the state constitution. Specific to the city, a racial zoning law was passed in 1924 that prohibited integration, except in cases where the majority of residents of the opposite race gave written approval. When legally challenged, the Louisiana Supreme Court sided with the racial zoning law. This would later be overturned by the U.S. Supreme Court in 1927, but the motivation for exclusionary laws would continue. Zoning laws came to be used frequently across America after the Supreme Court upheld the right of a municipality to determine land use in its case of *Euclid v. Ambler*, giving rise to what is now called Euclidian zoning. Single-family districts in New Orleans were zoned to exclude African Americans through covenants. The availability of real estate for these communities was further limited due to less desirable services, such as filling stations, being located in their neighborhoods.

Restrictive covenants existed in New Orleans before the FHA-backed loans incentivized white-only neighborhoods. The suburban development of Lakeview was laid out for development at the start of the 20th century. In construction dating back to 1913, the purchaser and developer agreed in writing “that no lots are to be sold to Negroes or colored people.”²⁶ The Louisiana Supreme Court would later uphold the constitutionality of such covenants, so long as they were between private entities.²⁹

These redlining practices are evident in newspaper advertisements for property in Hollygrove, such as those aimed at African American veterans after World War II.

Because of redlining policies as well as general discrimination against lower income populations, African American and immigrant residents of New Orleans did not have as many opportunities to own property. These limitations were compounded by the lack of available and affordable land. When Hollygrove was platted and developed, it was considered “undesirable” by white citizens, so developers (of various ethnic backgrounds, including Italians) built speculative housing to sell or rent to African American and Italian residents. When surveying the district, the author learned from one African American resident that his grandfather was unable to secure a mortgage on his own in the 1930s-40s when he wanted to buy a home, but his white boss assisted in securing him a property in Hollygrove.

Figure 2. 1935 Federal Home Loan Bank Mortgage Maps. Hollygrove is outlined in red. Source: www.nola.com.




Figure 3. 1935 Federal Home Loan Bank Mortgage Maps zoomed in to Hollygrove. Hollygrove is outlined in red. Source: www.nola.com.

The following descriptions of areas C41, C42, and D2³⁰ on the 1935 redlining map of Hollygrove reveal how these districts were viewed at the time and provide crucial information about the district's home ownership and demographics. It is key to remember that at this time, Hollygrove was in the midst of its first building boom, at which time many of the district's extant small bungalows and shotguns were constructed.

Zone C41, which is roughly located in the northeastern section of Hollygrove bounded by Olive, S. Carrollton, Earhart, and Joliet, had a "slowly" increasing population with most classified as "clerical – wage earners." The predominating building type was double "cottages" at 80% with the rest as single "cottages." 50-60% of the buildings were owner occupied. The description goes on to state:

This is an area of mixed singles and doubles, some fairly well maintained and some poorly maintained. Lots are small and the general appearance of the properties indicates little pride in ownership. Railroad track extends all through southern part of area and another is at the northern corridor of it. Lumber Company located at Fig and Dublin and several other industrial plants either in or adjoining area. It is

about 50% improved. Churches, schools, and large community business center convenient to area. Transportation is by street car on Carrollton and bus on Monroe. Monroe St. is paved but other streets gravel. Most all sidewalks are paved. In block bounded by Monroe, Oleander, Eagle, and Colapissa six new homes have recently been erected and all but one appears to have been sold. Remainder of block is vacant. On Colapissa, between Monroe and Leonidas, two 4-plexes have been built within past 2 years, containing 3-4 rm units, renting at \$20-25 per unit.³¹

Zone C42, the area that is the oldest and closest to S. Claiborne and S. Carrollton, had a “rapidly” increasing population made up of 2% residents who were classified as “clerical – wage earners – mechanics” (African Americans and white). Sixty percent of the buildings were 1 story double cottages that were 50% owner occupied, and 30% were 1 story single cottages that were 60% owner occupied. The report specifically mentions that the other 10% of the district was composed of single bungalows on Pritchard, Apricot, Belfast, and Joliet and was the “better older part.” 35 new single bungalows had been constructed within the last year and were readily selling. However,

[t]he surroundings on the northwest and northeast are much older properties, poorly maintained and occupied largely by [African Americans]; properties to the southeast are many years older and not so well maintained. Area has all utilities, school in area, churches convenient. Bus transportation on Claiborne and street cars on Carrollton. Large commercial center not far distant on Carrollton Ave.³²

The descriptions for both C rated zones provide key information about the district and support what is seen on the Sanborn maps from those years. It is interesting that it describes so much of the district as poorly maintained and clearly classifies run down areas with the African American population. This supports the oral history and other resources to show the blatant discrimination against neighborhoods that were not populated by “native” white residents.

The last area, D2, has much more colorful language describing its makeup. The population of area D2 was 5% “foreign families: Italian” and 35% African American, most of whom were classified as “low income laborers, wage earners, mechanics, WPA workers.” The predominant building type was double cottages (80%) with 30% owner occupied, followed by single cottages (20%) that were 40% owner occupied. In the last year, the report notes that no new houses were constructed and that mortgage funds for the district were limited.

This is an area of mixed properties and population. It is only about 50% improved. Small shacks are scattered through the area. Streets are gravel – 3 railroad tracks pass through the area. Properties on the whole poorly maintained. Best streets in area are Apple, Apricot, Belfast, Pritchard, Monroe, and Leonidas. Playground at Hamilton and Olive. School for whites in area D-4, for [African Americans] in this area. Stores scattered throughout area. [African American] church in area but short distance to white churches. Transportation is by gasoline bus on Leonidas and Monroe and is adequate.³³

It is within this context that Hollygrove was described as declining and hazardous to mortgage lenders, when, in actuality, the neighborhood was experiencing a building boom of bungalows and strong lot and home sales. Not only did residents build their own single-family homes, but the district also attracted its own residents as well as other building companies to purchase half blocks to whole blocks to build speculative housing.

In New Orleans, worker housing like that found in much of Hollygrove started with modest Creole Cottages in the Vieux Carré, Faubourg Marigny, Faubourg Treme, and the Irish Channel/Lower Garden District along the river. This building type would later be replaced primarily by the ubiquitous shotgun house, in both single and double forms, by the 1880s. Early in the history of worker housing in New Orleans, most were built as a one

off, but as years went by, these would be built by real estate developers in groups of three or four. With the arrival of large groups of immigrants and African Americans from rural areas between the 1880s and 1920s, New Orleans' population increased by more than 100%.³⁴ This resulted in a boom of shotgun house construction. Some were purely constructed for owner occupation while others, like many blocks in Hollygrove (i.e., 3014-3038 Leonidas) were built by real estate developers hoping to profit off the need for increased housing.³⁵ This type of development is found in several areas of Hollygrove with half blocks to full blocks of identical double shotguns or double shotguns with slight variations between them, but clearly built as a unit. Alternatively, real estate developers would also construct multi-family housing ranging from duplexes up to buildings with 6-8 units.

The second wave of construction in Hollygrove came in the Post-World War II era (generally recognized as 1945-65) with minimal traditional cottages and transitional ranch houses. One ranch house type, discussed in Section 7, is a simple one-story house with diamond louvered vents in the gable ends, and small porches on the side, many of which were infilled to capture more interior space. Most of these are found in the northwest section of Hollygrove with almost full blocks of them along Stroelitz. Others are interspersed throughout the district on lots that were either vacant or where older homes were demolished for the new construction. Through the 1950s and 1960s, the rest of Hollygrove lots were filled with ranch houses of varying sizes. By 1965, the blocks of Hollygrove were full.

With the boom in construction of both apartment buildings and single/double cottages, this allowed lower income people to either rent or own their own property in Hollygrove. Per the 1940 census, rental and ownership status varied by blocks, but the majority of residents owned their properties. The larger apartment buildings were also generally owned or built by Hollygrove residents to increase their incomes. This generational ownership is still found in Hollygrove today. Some current residents are in their 80s or 90s and have lived in the same house since they were born. Others inherited their home from their parents or grandparents. Several residents also noted that while their grandparents lived in Hollygrove, they lived across S. Carrollton and would come visit every weekend. Their parents would bring them to S. Carrollton, help them cross the street, and they would then spend their time in Hollygrove. This generational history lends the district a distinctly familial feel today.

Hollygrove's Resources

Hollygrove Historic District encompasses a variety of residential, commercial, and industrial structures dating from the early to mid-twentieth century. More than a collection of buildings, these structures together provided the physical framework for a tight-knit African American and Italian immigrant community that persisted and thrived during the era of Jim Crow segregation.

In Blokker's 2012 historic context, she notes that the associated property types include the following resources: residential; enslavement; labor, agriculture, and industry; religious; educational; professional and artistic; commercial; social; recreational; political; military; medical; and districts. Hollygrove is naturally a district and retains residential, industrial, religious, professional, commercial, social, and recreational resources within it.

This section is intended to identify some of the significant resources that contributed to the district's development. Within Hollygrove, there are a few major landmarks such as the Waldo-Burton Memorial Home; various religious facilities such as Mt. Rock Missionary Baptist Church and St. Anthony Divine Spiritual Temple of Christ; the industrial complexes of the former American Chicle Company and NOLA Box Supply; and the large recreational resources of Lincoln Park, Cuccia-Byrnes Playground, and the Mamie Conrad Playground. As mentioned in Section 7, there are also distinct commercial corridors that developed primarily along the major east-west streets of S. Claiborne Avenue and S. Carrollton Avenue as well as Earhart Boulevard once it replaced the original rail line. Along these corridors, one- and two-story retail were constructed. More industrial development is found along Earhart Boulevard.

Within the residential sections of Hollygrove, corner stores have been an integral building type and provide an important walkable amenity for nearby residents. The significance of these commercial areas derives from the fact that they were developed during the Jim Crow era to serve a segregated clientele. According to "The African American Experience in Louisiana," "commercial properties reflect the manner in which rigid segregation permeated every aspect of life. Banned or provided with only the most limited services from most white businesses according to Jim Crow laws, African Americans needed separate commercial facilities of all kinds."³⁶ Within Hollygrove, these businesses were operated by both African Americans and Italians, as both communities were discriminated against and needed to develop their own businesses to serve their communities.




Figure 4. 1937-51 Sanborn of Cuccia-Byrnes Playground. Source: Library of Congress.




Figure 5. 1937-51 Sanborn of Lincoln Park (formerly Muny Park)

The history of the district's recreational resources reflects the era in which Hollygrove developed. Lincoln Park was constructed as Muny Park in 1942 and comprises the present-day baseball stadium located at 3401 Joliet Street on the far-left side of the Cuccia-Byrnes Playground. This park served the white residents of Hollygrove and was renovated in 1965 to contain most of what is present today (it was renovated minimally in 1989, and the current exterior walls were built in 2004). Per 1937-51 Sanborn maps (see Figures 4 and 5), the rest of the playground had large open fields and a single playshed. Today it has open fields, two small baseball fields, and a modern bathroom/concession stand. The Mamie Conrad Playground and Park, for African American residents of Hollygrove, at Olive and Mistletoe Streets, was dedicated in April of 1950. The park was named for Mamie Conrad, who won awards from the National Playgrounds Association and served as the supervisor of the Thomy Lafon Community Center in the past 15 years. At the time it opened, the park had swings, a merry-go-round, see-saw, basketball court, and a softball field. The New Orleans Recreation Department's African American choir took part in the ceremonies.³⁷ In 1956, a new park building was constructed at the park that included a dressing room, supervisor's office, and a storeroom.³⁸ Portions of this shelter remain with additions made in the 1990s.

Together, these two parks have served the surrounding communities since as early as the mid-1930s. Following desegregation, the parks have served the district's entire population.

Residential Development

From the early-twentieth century, when the oldest portions of the district were settled, through the mid-twentieth century, African Americans and Italians were able to buy property, build homes, and raise families in the area that became known as Hollygrove. Census data from the 1940s and 1950s indicates that the population was comprised primarily of these two ethnic groups. According to Earl Williams, a longtime resident, Hollygrove was spatially integrated, but not socially integrated. Palm Street to Airline Highway was mostly African American with some Italians interspersed.³⁹ The area between Palm and S. Carrollton was almost all white residents and most residents, including the handful of African American residents, were homeowners. This firsthand experience from Mr. Williams is supported by the census data with blocks along the main commercial thoroughfares of S. Carrollton and S. Claiborne and blocks becoming predominantly African American as the streets move west and north. All of the groceries and many businesses were owned by Italians.⁴⁰ By the 1960s and early 1970s, many white residents had moved out and were renting their properties. By the late 1970s, the black middle class also left the area due to rising crime.⁴¹

Discriminatory housing practices prohibited African Americans and Italian immigrants from moving into predominantly white neighborhoods except for those with sections that could be classified as slums, and in neighborhoods that were open to them, such as Central City and Seventh Ward, quality affordable housing was scarce.⁴² While Civil Rights legislation lifted many of the legal barriers to fair housing, these early patterns of development had lasting implications. Neighborhoods such as Hollygrove Historic District, built largely by

and for African Americans and Italians, remain predominantly black today. The wide variety of modest homes that define the character of the district—from the earliest Craftsman bungalows and double shotguns to 1940s minimal traditional cottages and 1950s brick ranches—reflect the two primary ethnic groups that settled in the neighborhood, which they saw as a place of opportunity and self-advancement during a period of overt racism and legalized segregation practices.

Conclusion:

The buildings and structures within the Hollygrove Historic District reflect an important period in the history of New Orleans. The district is significant as an example of a mixed-use urban neighborhood of predominantly African American and immigrant residents that developed between the early and mid-twentieth century during segregation. Hollygrove grew out of land that was uninhabitable, at a time when societal practices specifically aimed to strip African Americans and Italian immigrants from having the same rights as other New Orleanians. The distinct reclamation and planning for the former swampy area that ultimately became Hollygrove was significant within the overall context of New Orleans' history. Redlining practices, amongst other forms of discrimination, sought to label areas such as Hollygrove as undesirable. Despite all of this, the district was able to grow and prosper. Residents were able to own their own residential and commercial properties, provide for their families, build careers, and create a strong sense of community that has been maintained through the present day. Home is something that you build and the residents of Hollygrove from the beginning have built a strong sense of place, not only through tangible historic resources, but through landscapes and a shared history. Even today, residents are seeking to collect oral history to document the struggles that their relatives overcame in order to build Hollygrove.

Hollygrove residents have been resilient, from the neighborhood's earliest days through the record-setting natural disaster of Hurricane Katrina and its aftermath. Since it was first developed in 1909, Hollygrove has stood as an emblem of hard work, perseverance, and strength amongst communities who were regularly told they were not worthy of the same rights as their fellow citizens.

Carrollton Avenue and the Carrollton National Register Historic District to the west, and Airline Highway to the north.

Boundary Justification (Explain why the boundaries were selected.)

The proposed boundaries of the Hollygrove Historic District are based primarily on the district's relationships to adjacent neighborhoods and landscape features of drainage canals. As shown on **Map 2**, the eastern boundary roughly follows S. Carrollton Avenue and the boundaries of the Carrollton National Register Historic District. The southern boundary is S. Claiborne Avenue and the boundaries of the Carrollton National Register Historic District. The Jefferson/Orleans Parish line and drainage canal to the west is an obvious visual boundary. Airline Highway marks the northern boundary. In some locations, the boundary lines expand or contract to eliminate vacant parcels/parking lots or non-contributing resources or to capture a particularly important contributing resource.



Hollygrove Historic District - Orleans Parish, Louisiana - National Register Status Map




Hollygrove Historic District - Orleans Parish, Louisiana - Lat/Long Map
