
## LANDERNEAU MOUNDS

his site is an excellent example of a small Troyville hamlet/village. Landerneau has two dome-shaped mounds and an associated village midden (accumulated debris), and is about 300 feet west of the Boeuf River. Each mound was built in a single stage. The taller one (Md. A), about 4 feet high and 130 feet in diameter, serves as a historic cemetery. The other mound (Md. B) is 3 feet tall and about 135 feet in diameter. The modern 2-story house on it was built on the site of the original homeplace of the Landerneau family. Highway construction exposed the midden on the east side of the site. A 1998 excavation found pottery, bone, and shell there, and showed that fish was the main food source. Radiocarbon dating of charcoal from the site gives an age of AD 530−590 (Troyville period). Because it's a "single component site" (only one culture lived there), it was easier for archaeologists to accurately determine the food and artifacts the Troyville people used. □
