Proces Verbal of Examination of  
Louis Serel.

Investigation conducted before Lepage Duprat, acting as Clerk of Court; Martin de Longraye, Inspector of Ste. Catherine Concession and representing it; and Francois Louis De Merveilleux, Commandant, acting as Judge.

Then follows the copy of bill-of-lading and a copy of the receipt in favor of de Longraye. The bill-of-lading covers beans, peas, oil seed corn, salt, gun-powder, lead, a chest with lock, etc., but no value is put on this cargo. The original receipt is signed by Louis Serel.

Investigation shows that the pirogue belonged to Ste. Catherine Concession and was loaded with a cargo consigned to Dumanoir at New Orleans; that there were 3 other pirogues making this trip. Two of the pirogues were totally lost, ladings included, by capsizing on striking an upright snag. The two others kept afloat by throwing overboard most of the cargo. Louis Serel saved himself by swimming. At day-break Serel induced all the rest of the party to go ashore since he had no more pirogue and he could not find anything from his cargo. Among his personal belongings he lost shirts, shoes, hat, etc., and a note for 20 livres of Dumanoir in the Concession, all the papers and letters, including his own private ones.

PETITION

Madame Perrine Lemarié, widow of Desmorieres, acting for herself and her nieces, the Misses Le Blanc, alleges that she was granted, on her arrival in this town, September 1724, an allowance (alimony) of 1500 francs for support of herself and her family. Mr. Duval was to have paid this pension (alimony). He paid two sums, 600 francs and 500 francs; and since "it is plain as day" that 600 francs plus 500 francs make 1100 francs there still remains 400 francs due.

Duval pretends to have covered the deficit in rice, beans and rent bills; but those items were included in past receipts to him.

Plaintiff therefore prays that Duval be ordered to pay the 400 livres plus interests and costs.

The dispute arose over Dalcour's plan of ditching. He kept his ditch (9 feet wide by 3 1/2 deep) fairly on his side, and left a margin of 8 feet for depositing the excavated earth. Planchard is not satisfied with this arrangement and claims the said margin.

Dalcour, in turn, takes the stand that Planchard should run his (Planchard's) ditch directly along Dalcour's land, but that he, too, should have a raised border, to prevent overflow on Dalcour's land.
