It is stipulated that a certain sum of money will be set aside for the children already born or to be born, the preciput being (not stated).

The 4 children of the late Mr. Viger will be boarded, lodged and kept up free of charges, out of the funds of the community until they will reach 15 years of age.

Sr. Fleuriau, Procurator General, represents that Sr. Damaron with his family, had left La Balize on the vessel "St. Paul" for St. Domingue in 1734; that his effects had preceded him on the vessel "St. Anne" which had carried him as far as La Balize; that Sr. Damaron never reached St. Domingue; that he died on board the ship; that his widow, Dame Françoise Trepagnier, returned to New Orleans with "Manon" Damaron, aged seven or eight years, the child of Sr. Damaron and Catherine Duchemin, his first wife, and with Genevieve Damaron, her own child born of her marriage with said Damaron; that the only property known to belong to decedent in this Province is a certain house in New Orleans; that it is necessary to elect a tutor and under-tutor to both minor children; that the widow, being also a minor, cannot act as such except under a curatorship.

Said meeting was convened to elect a tutor and under-tutor to the minors, Marie Damaron, aged seven or eight years (daughter of said François Damaron and Catherine Duchemin), and Genevieve Damaron, aged three or four years, daughter of François Damaron and Françoise Trepagnier, his widow; and a curator to said Dame Damaron, evidently also a minor.

All persons present at the meeting being relatives of Genevieve Damaron and none being related to Marie Damaron, they recused themselves from acting in the case of the latter.

Dame Damaron was elected tutrix of her daughter, Genevieve, under the curatorship of Sr. Lassus Marsilly.

The future wife is to have privilege of accepting or refusing community. In case of refusal her dot is to revert to her.

Community to begin from date of wedding. The income from community from her first marriage being stopped at hour of inventory, is to begin again under proper administration.

At second the bidding started with de Beauparer offering 1000 livres for each family, and 100 livres for each child and rose to 1220 for each family and 115 for each child offered by Villars Dubreuil. Sale withdrawn on account of low bids.

On May 4, 1735 the property went up for third time and began with Dubreuil's bid of 1220 per family and 115 per child and closed with Dubreuil bidding 1300 per family, 130 per child and 3000 for plantation, in 3 equal payments covering period of 3 years, and Macarty bidding 1000 on lot in city.

Fourth sale October 4th, 1735. Opened with bid by Baldic, surgeon of 3000 for the 13 sick and infirm negroes, and closed with Dubreuil bidding 3500 for them.

Declaration of Henry Gapaillard to the effect that he has made three or four trips with Bunel, Peron, Joseph Catoire, as well as Judice and La Forest; that on the first trip they found nothing; that on the second, they found corpses which they buried on the coast, on one of which was a dagger with a silver hilt; that they found several chests, one of which was filled with papers, which they brought to Gonzalle. In other chests were bolts of silk, damaged coats, hats and shoes, reales which he was told amounted to sixty, which were used for drinks of which he had a share. On the third trip they found the wreck from which they drew a package of indigo, some hammocks, silk known as soye soye, four to five hundred skins for shoe leather. On the fourth trip they found two swords, one with silver and the other with brass. On the third trip they were joined by La Liberté, La Combe, and Chauvin, who drew out a chest or box of which they broke the lock, and they were seen taking therefrom round piastres, (dollard), which they shared among themselves.
