The parties with the aid and advice of their relatives, including the mother of the future wife, and Pierre Delile, known as Dupare, her under-tutor, both acting for her, agree and promise to take each other in lawful marriage, to be solemnized in the Holy Catholic Church.

They agree to the community of acquets and gains according to the custom of Paris.

The parties agree to pay their own debts before marriage, neither of them to be responsible for debts contracted by the other before marriage.

The future wife brings as dowry 3000 livres represented by slaves, cattle, household furniture and furnishings, clothes and jewels, being an "advance" made on her share of inheritance from her father, one-third of which advance shall fall into the community, the other two-thirds to be reserved for any children who may be born of said future marriage, together with any sums which may accrue to the future wife thereafter.

(cont'd)

The future husband makes a marriage settlement of 3000 livres on the future wife, the principal which shall revert to the children who may be born of said marriage.

The parties agree to a preciput of 1000 livres.

The future husband makes a donation inter vivos to the future wife of all of his property in the event that no children be born of said marriage.
