To several negresses, slaves in the household, she bequeaths underwear.

A bequest of 170 livres is made to the mother of Reverend Father Chrisostome, Capuchin Priest.

The testatrix, after making provisions and giving instructions for payment of various debts,

After recommending his soul to God and to his Patron Saint and directing that his funeral be simple, testator declares that he and Sr. Fillart are joint owners of the ship "St. Louis"; that although said ship was purchased from Vincent Lepré in the name of Sr. Dubreuil, testator paid the purchase price thereof and that Sr. Fillart is entitled to one-half the proceeds from the operation of said ship, having furnished 4600 pounds of tobacco to the cargo, and made advances of money to the partnership.

Testator appoints Sr. D'Auseville as his testamentary executor, declaring that he has left his wife and children in Bordeaux, for whom the property is to be conserved and administered without recourse to tribunals of justice until it is delivered to them.

Testator desires that the outfitting, loading and operations of the "St. Louis" be continued by Sr. Fillart and that an accounting thereof be made by the testamentary executor to testator's family.
