Petitioner alleges further that Sr. Petit then went to the Pascagoula River where she had some slaves tilling the soil and there took possession of a certain negro and negress belonging to her.

Respondent denies that he abducted plaintiff's said slaves.

Respondent avers that it would be useless to enter into details concerning Dame Huet's claim against the former business partnership and that her only possible witnesses would be Reverend Father Mathias and Monsieur de Beauchamps.

Respondent avers further that although he has disposed of the negroes allotted to him, he is nevertheless asked to submit them fictitiously in a new partition; that plaintiff had been satisfied with the first partition and evidently had had no intention of repudiating respondent's account, but that subsequently she has, under the specious pretext of necessity, sold the slaves and cattle of said Succession, without regard to the rights of the Company of the Indies or the heirs.

Wherefore respondent prays that there be judgment in his favor condemning said Dame Huet to furnish strict proof of her allegations, and ordering that a new partition be effected after payment shall have been made to the Company of the Indies from the "mass" of the Succession, Respondent reserving his rights for amounts expended by him in the last illness of his brother-in-law.
