Monsieur Rasteau embarked in order to obtain instructions from commanding officer. These gentlemen have signified how happy they would have been for the honor of his escort had it been possible. Monsieur le Chevalier D'Aubigny, commander, granted us a day's delay for purpose of revictualizing.

Respondents further aver that at the time of the marriage of Andre Carriere and Marie Arlut (wife by second marriage of Sr. Tixerant) said Carriere caused an inventory to be taken of his property which was appraised at approximately 12000 livres, but that said property, consisting at that time of slaves and lands, has now become practically non-existent, there being only two slaves left, namely, Francois and Jeanneton, known as "Maman Gros", and the lands having long

since been abandoned and being unknown to the heirs.

Respondents further represent that it is certain that the community property of Andre Carriere, deceased, and said Dame Tixerant (Marie Arlut) at the time of their marriage amounted to the sum of 4,000 livres and that the other 8000 livres which the co-heirs claim by preference would appear to be correct if it were proven that Sr. Carriere really brought same to the Community.

Respondents state further that all the property which was found at the time of the death of said Sr. Carriere was acquired, earned and improved during the community which existed between him and said Marie Arlut, such as the Plantation at English Turn, the negroes now in existence, part of whose purchase price is still due the Company of the Indies, the lots of ground in New Orleans, and the furniture and furnishings shown in the inventory of the property of Sr. Carriere after his death; that the property claimed by the heirs as the separate property of their father prior to his marriage is no longer in existence, with the exception of the two slaves hereinabove mentioned; and that there is a possibility that the property shown in the inventory taken before the marriage of said Carriere and Marie Arlut was sold at auction prior to said marriage.

Respondents further represent that the rule laid down by the co-heirs with regard to respondents' producing documentary proof, should be made to apply to said co-heirs.
