Sr. Nicolas Judice claims that as the uncle of the minor he is entitled to the tutorship, whereas preference has been given to a stranger.

Said Sieur Nicolas Judice avers that the Procurator General performed his duty in convening a family meeting to elect a tutor and special tutor to the minor, regardless of the last will of decedent, (not binding in regard to tutorship), but he deems it unjust that the deliberations of a family meeting should be expected to conform to the clause of said will and testament, excluding him from a tutorship which, under the law (on account of his relationship to the minor), he would be forced to accept were it tendered.

Sr. Judice also avers that Sr. Darby, named tutor in decedent's will, is not a native Frenchman; that this fact precludes his exercise of the functions of a tutor, and even if he were naturalized he would still be barred from exercising certain civil rights, including that of tutorship.

Answering the charge of unseemly conduct, Sr. Judice avers that it could not disqualify him unless proven and he very sarcastically offers the position of "honorary tutor" to the Procurator, whose duties it would be to watch the tutor.

Sr. Judice claims that the very fact that the opinions of the family meeting were so much at variance should resolve the doubt in favor of the paternal uncle as tutor. He refuses to act in the subordinate capacity of special tutor to his nephew and brother-in-law.
