Mr. Jean Baptiste Chavannes, colonist, gave Sieur Pierre Ancelin, merchant, a letter of exchange for 2400 livres drawn on Sieur Bricogne, Treasury General of the Clergy, receiving the amount in ready cash, by private signature, mortgaging a negress named Nanette and her daughter Marie, also a negro named Petit; said negress to be sold in case of protest; and another negress named Therese, if the amount derived from their sale would not be sufficient to reimburse the value of said letter of exchange and costs.

The letter of exchange, after being endorsed to Sieur Boissard and to Sieur Sauvage and Company, having come to protest, Sieur Ancelin petitioned to Superior Council to recover said amount from Mr. Chavannes and demand the seizure and sale of the negroes.

The Superior Council considering all papers pertaining to said case, ordered a judgment by default against defendant, Sieur Chavannes having failed to appear and to be re-summoned at the next session of the Council.

The Procurator-General represents that a rumor which has persisted for several months, to the effect that Sr. Raguét has been shipwrecked and has perished on the Coast of Florida, seems to have been confirmed by the following:

A letter written to Sr. de Vaudreuil, Governor of Louisiana, by the Governor of Havana.

A letter written to Sr. Garic by the First Pilot of the Vessel "The King of Spain".

A declaration made before the Clerk of Court by a sailor who had gone to Havana and who claimed that he had spoken to a survivor of the shipwreck who had assured him that he had seen the dead body of Sr. Rasteau on the sand on the Coast of Florida, where the waves had cast him.

Letter written to Sr. Garic, expressing the surmise that the news of the death of Sieurs Rasteau, et al, by drowning in the Peignon River, on the Coast of Florida, must have reached him via Sr. Du Piquery's ship, and stating that seventeen ships have been lost.

News to the same effect brought by Sr. Fleuret and another survivor (of the storm) who delivered Sr. Rasteau's hat and watch to the Governor to aid in establishing proof of his (Rasteau's) death to serve in having prayers offered for the repose of his soul and that of Sr. Comet and others.

The Procurator General represents that in the event Sr. Rasteau's ship left Carolina as scheduled (in November) it is indeed proper to offer prayers for his soul, as the storm which occurred was very terrible and he believes that not a ship on that coast escaped it; that the Port of Florida is a narrow river and that twelve vessels were thrown on the shore by the sea, but were subsequently released.

The Procurator-General represents further that in view of the foregoing documents and of the fact that no news has been received from Sr. Rasteau in eight months, it is proper that the present cognizance be made of record.

The Procurator represents that Sr. Rasteau has left a minor widow, who may not attend to his affairs, and that he had charge of a considerable amount of merchandise, effects and money for account of various persons; that there has in fact been instituted a suit against him by Sr. Moulinier, agent and attorney in fact of Sr. Leon Brethous, for the sum of 4698 piastres 5 deniers; and that Sr. Rasteau had granted credit in large sums and to numerous persons, according to his books of account, collection of which sums should be made.

The Procurator-General further represents that in the interests of the creditors and all whom it may concern, and in order to prevent the deterioration of any effects of said succession, it is necessary that seals be affixed to all the objects thereof and that an inventory thereof be taken.

Wherefore the Procurator General prays for an order to affix seals on the effects, titles and papers of decedent, left by him in this Colony, either in the said widow's possession or elsewhere, in the presence of said widow, of the creditors of said Succession and other interested parties, and to take inventory.
